

## ELECTRICAL CERTIFICATION FOR NEWLY-CONSTRUCTED RESIDENCES

The Company cannot activate or connect a customer's wiring to it's facilities in a <u>newly constructed</u> single family residence\*occupied or to be occupied by the customer until <u>all</u> of the building wiring has been inspected/certified by a State or Local Inspector, Master Electrician or Limited Electrician in house wiring.

32 MRSA § 1105 Certification of a Single-Family Dwelling

RESIDENTIAL ACCOUNT NO.:

Nothing in this chapter may prevent a person from making electrical installations in a single-family residence occupied by him or to be occupied by him as his bona feed personal abode, providing that the installation conforms to the standards of the National Electric Code. Any electrical installations made under the authority of the paragraph, after July 1, 1987, in a newly constructed residence, shall require certification by a State or Local inspector, master electrician or limited electrician in house wiring prior to the activation of electricity by the utility company.
